VOLUNTEER DIVER MASTERS (VOLUNTEERS)

We are able to keep day camp prices so low for all families only because we have a 100% volunteer staff. Each Pack that sends scouts is asked to provide 1 adult volunteer for every 4 scouts.

Volunteers can help in a variety of ways; some jobs require additional training beyond the Youth Protection Training and camp specific training meeting. All volunteers need to bring Parts A & B of the Annual Health and Medical Record.

Scouts BSA age youth, both male and female, are invited to join as den chiefs and jr. staff members. Young adult volunteers help make camp fabulous for our Cub Scout age campers.

LITTLE SWIMMERS (WEE CAMP)

Wee Camp is available for the non-scout age children of adult volunteers **while the adult is working in camp**. It is led by qualified adult leadership.


Children must be potty-trained to be in Wee Camp.

SIGN UP (REGISTRATION)

Please register your scout according to his rank in the fall of 2019. Your Pack Day Camp Coordinator can collect your registration forms and fees, or you may register and pay for your scout online at www.blackhawkscouting.org.

Registrations must be completed 30 days before camp. Late registrations are subject to a \$10 fee, and campers are not guaranteed a t-shirt on the first day of camp. Late fees are waived for scouts who are new to Scouting or their Pack.

ADVENTURE GEAR (CAMP UNIFORM)

All Day Camps have a Medical Officer in camp while campers are present.


All persons in camp must have Parts A & B of the Annual Health and Medical record on file for the duration of camp. Medical records will not be retained after camp closes.
