It was created to help Venturers learn and practice the attitudes and skills effective leaders demonstrate. Completion of ILSC is a requirement for the Discovery Award in the Venturing program and is a prerequisite for Venturers to participate in the more advanced leadership courses like National Youth Leadership Training (NYLT) and National Advanced Youth Leadership Experience (NAYLE).
