What to Bring (mark all items with the Scout's name and pack number):

- Sack Lunch (Scouts will keep lunches in their backpack)
- Water Bottle
- Small Backpack for Personal Gear and Lunch
- Rain Gear (Camp will go on rain or shine)
- Hat
- Sunblock
- Bug Repellent (non-aerosol)
- A Great Attitude

Please leave all knives, weapons (of any kind), toys or collectibles, electronic devices, expensive personal items, and bad attitudes at home.

Camp Medical Information:

ALL persons in camp (youth and adult) must have parts A and B of the Annual Health and Medical Record on file for the duration of the camp.



Thank you for entrusting your Scout to us for our Nationally Accredited Cub Scout Day Camp. Day camp is often the highlight of the summer Cub Scout program, designed to engage the interests and meet the needs of Cub Scout aged children. Activities at our camp include crafts, games, archery, BB guns, nature, Scout skills, and much more, all under the supervision of certified leadership and a dedicated and qualified staff.

Day Camp Dates (based on rank in fall 2022):

- Tiger Day (all Scouts must have an adult 18 or over with them at camp): Tuesday, August 2
- Wolf and Bear: Tuesday, August 2 and Wednesday, August 3
- Webelos and Arrow or Light:
 Thursday, August 4 and Friday, August 5

Day Camp Schedule:

Registration/Check-In: 8:30-9:00 am

Opening Ceremony and Activities Begin: 9:00 am

Closing: 3:00 pm

Camp Attire:

The camp uniform is the official camp t-shirt, which is worn each day of camp. Campers may choose to wear shorts or pants. For safety reasons, ALL campers and staff must wear closed toed shoes or boots and socks.

Registration:

Please register your Scout according to their rank in the fall of 2022. Your Pack Day Camp Coordinator can collect your registration fees, or you may register and pay for your Scout online using the calendar at blackhawkscouting.org.

Camp fees are \$35 per Scout (Tiger fee is \$20). Register by June 17 to guarantee shirt size. Registrations include a T-shirt, patch, and memories to last a lifetime. Adults attending camp are required to purchase a camp T-shirt for \$7. EACH UNIT IS RESPONISLBE FOR ENSURING THEY HAVE ENOUGH ADULTS FOR TWO-DEEP LEADERSHIP EACH DAY.

Only campers and adults that are registered for camp are allowed to attend and only on the days for which they are registered.

Transportation:

Parents bring Scouts to camp each day. Scouts will only be released to adults designated in the Annual Health and Medical Record as authorized to take Scouts from events. Please be sure to specify all adults who will be transporting Scouts on the medical form. The adult responsible for drop off and pick up will also need to sign the Scout in and out each day.

It is important to drop off and pick up Scouts on time to allow camp to run smoothly. Scouts who are dropped off late or need to be picked up early will need to be dropped off/picked up at Camp Headquarters. Please contact the Camp Director to make the necessary arrangeme
