### Safety

The safety of our youth and volunteers is of the utmost importance! Please review the following with ALL Scouts, Parents and Adult Leaders prior to attending the Klondike Derby event.

- All attendees **must** have appropriate clothing for the weather. **\*Scouts without proper clothing will be sent home.**
- Warming centers & Restrooms will be open at various locations around camp. Please utilize these when needed! (**First Aid** will be located at Main Warming Center)
- Be sure to pack **extra** hats, gloves, and socks, in case they get wet or lost.
- Remember **C.O.L.D.**
  - **C** – Keep Clean
  - **O** – Avoid Overheating
  - **L** – Loose Layers
  - **D** – Keep Dry

## Stations

Each Cub should bring a daypack with their SIX essentials (First-aid kit, Reusable Water Bottle, Flashlight, Trail Food, Sun Protection, Whistle). Each team will be issued a sled with equipment and a Husky Pup (Stuffed). The Cubs will go on an adventure through a series of stations! Be sure to check the weather before arrival (raingear might be a good idea if wet weather is expected). Please remember it is just as important to stay hydrated in the winter!

Cubs will start the day getting photos with their Patrol and sleds, followed by "sled inspections". From there everyone will move with their teams to the various stations.

***\*Some stations are subject to change due to weather and snow conditions.***

## SnowScout Race

Each Patrol will do a timed race on a 20 yard track with their patrol sleds (Main Field). At the destination point, Patrols will race to build a Snow "Scout" (because Scouts don't make Snow Men, they make Snow "Scouts"). Successful completion requires a finished Snow "Scout" (Completion: contains a snow formation, biodegradable eyes, nose, mouth and two arms). Patrols will disperse through Activity Stations according to Patrol Schedules.

## "Cliff" Climb

Each Patrol will track "Raptor" Prints up the Scout Law Cliff "Climb." Use the available ropes & pulley elevator to secure your Husky pup's safe "climb." Careful, watch out for the Snow Snakes in Snow Snake Valley!

## Snow Snake Valley

Each Patrol will be given an opportunity to participate in a time held tradition of many tribes of the Great Lakes Region. These snakes don't bite.

## Down for the Count

Watch out for risky situations! Each Patrol will follow storyline prompts utilizing outdoor, basic first-aid, fitness, navigation, and team skills. Practice Safe Scouting!

## Stretcher Carry

Each Patrol will carry an injured teammate to safety using basic first-aid and completion of a 3-part Survival Quiz. Patrols will seek out hidden items to build a make-shift stretcher to transport your teammate to safety.

## Lunch & Game Break

ALL Cub Scout Patrols will meet in the Johnson building for a warm prepared meal and lunchtime entertainment. This will be a great time for warming up, restroom access, & changing socks for dry & happy feet!

## "Orient" a Graphic Map

Using a Picture Map, each Patrol will utilize orienteering, knots, and fitness skills to navigate terrain to bring your injured teammate to safety. Be prepared for unpredictable situations that will put your outdoor skills to test.

## "Below Zero Hero"

Each Patrol will continue practicing outdoor skills while learning FIVE Fire Building Methods (Bears-AOLs will be allowed to build and light a SMALL Fire, to "boil" a shallow pan of water) and build a Tarp Lean To Shelter for your injured teammate to warm up.

## SnowScout Demo!

Each Patrol will rally to the Main Field, to race your sled through a small obstacle course. Leaving No Trace, each Patrol will race to their Snow "Scout" to demolish their Snow "Scout" Sculpture.

## Program Closing

Patrols will then meet with fellow Patrols for our closing Ceremony for Klondike Derby 2024. Please join us for an Award Ceremony to distribute Klondike Derby patches, certificates, event tchotchkes, and Patrol pictures. Awards for 1st, 2nd, & 3rd Place will be awarded for Snow Snake Race, Sled Race, & "Good Turn" Patrol. Thank you's to volunteers will also be shared, followed by check-out.

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
