The only way to counter this threat is to release into nature the only creature on Earth that can vanquish the Siberian Viper...the Scout Snow Snake. Ah, but the release of the Snow Snake can be precarious and there is a technique to it. Are Scouts up to the challenge?

The Icicle Melt

The Yukon Outbreak

Supplies: Scouts will need to bring a fire starting kit.

Tinder, kindling, fuel (wood), as well as container and a thermometer will be provided.

While scouting way up north in the Yukon, a patrol encounters a prospector who has fallen victim to the Yukon Outbreak. He is desperately in need of medical attention. He can barely speak. His only words are

"water...I need water." The waters in the area are making people sick, so the water must be boiled first.

You are in a race against time to supply adequate, safe drinking water to the victim. Unfortunately, your patrol's matches were soaked during a recent weather event involving a wintry mix of rain and snow.
